

Resolution No. 3 2024

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY AUDITOR TO APPROVE A "THEN AND NOW" CERTIFICATE FROM THE GENERAL FUND 1001-0832-57200 TO PAY FOR SERVICES ALREADY RENDERED BY WOODY SANDER FORD FOR REPAIRS TO A CITY VEHICLE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City Auditor has requested that the Council authorize the Auditor to approve a "Then and Now" certificate payable to Woody Sanders Ford for a total of \$6,675.69 to cover the cost repairs to a city vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the amount of \$6,675.69 exceeds the threshold of \$3,000 that the Auditor, Ken Miracle, can approve; and


WHEREAS, the payment is for repairs to a city vehicle, which was covered by insurance. The insurance check was accidentally paid to the city, rather than to Wood Sander Ford. No purchase order existed for the expense, as it was expected to be paid by the insurer directly to Wood Sander Ford on the city's behalf; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Norwood, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The City Auditor's office is hereby authorized to approve a "Then and Now" certificate payable to Woody Sander Ford for a total of \$6,675.69 from **GENERAL FUND 1001-0842-57200** to cover the cost of repairs to a city vehicle. This certificate shall state that both at the time the contract was made (then) and at the time the certificate is executed (now), the amount of the contract has been lawfully appropriated for the purpose of the contract, that the appropriation remains unencumbered and that resources to pay the obligation when it comes due are on hand or in the process of collection to the credit of **GENERAL FUND 1001-0842-57200**.

SECTION 2. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency resolution and a measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare and shall go into effect forthwith. The reason for said emergency is the necessity to proceed forthwith to authorize payment for services rendered by Woody Sanders Ford for the repairs of a city vehicle to avoid incurring any late fees and/or penalties on that payment.
